




Challenges* GIS as a flat play ground for students and researchers with various background



Since 2005, Niigata University has committed on the project of GIS (Geographic Information System). In its effort to make it an academic infra, Niigata University has done supports, inviting users from as many fields as possible.

GIS Disaster Study groups in Niigata University contributed for the emergency mapping supports and recovery services at the time of Chuetsu Oki Earthquake (2007) and this also resulted in the Special Achievement in GIS (SAG) Award by ESRI International (2008).









Challenges* Toki Project and Sado Island Recover the Wholeness of Our Environment

Niigata has an Island, Sado (1hr distance by a jet ferry), and there Niigata University has an exercise field for forestry. This is our gem as it boasts of its richness of biodiversity as well as the colony of ancient cedars that has survived more than 500 years. This forest absorbs about 3,000 ton of CO₂ per year.

Toki Project is a cross-sectional enterprise that involves local and state governments, citizen groups, local residents, and the Niigata University. It aims at returning the surviving TOKI birds to the wild life of Sado Island.
